

Fukuoka! What a Delicious City!

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During March 26 to 29, I visited Fukuoka which is the central city of Kyusyu region. It is not my first time but probably 3rd or 4th time to visit Fukuoka. Frankly speaking, I cannot remember how many times to visit this city, because it was always short visiting like just half of a day. This time, staying about four days are enough to enjoy Fukuoka, and it was really meaningful time to interview.

The biggest reason is delicious dishes of Fukuoka such like Tonkotsu Ramen (とんこつラーメン; noodle with a pork bone broth), Motsunabe (もつ鍋; giblets cooked in a hot pot), and Mentaiko (明太子; seasoned cod roe) so on.
